Interested in helping your church? Want to get involved in St. Thomas decision-making? Please consider running for an open Vestry position. Elections of four new Vestry members will take place in January. Matt Heiskell, Florita Montgomery, Beth Royall, and Tom Waggoner will be finishing their Vestry terms.

The Vestry at St. Thomas à Becket is a 12-member body that forms the lay leadership of our church. We function as representatives for all church membership, as a board for collective decision making, and as individual leaders. Duties of the Vestry range from large responsibilities—like overseeing the upkeep of the building and authorizing major expenses—to small tasks—such as counting money or locking the church. Members are elected to three-year terms, during which we attend monthly meetings and participate in an annual ministry review.
